You are invited to the annual Peninsula Drainage District #2 (PEN 2) virtual landowner meeting at 6pm on **Thursday, October 27th**.

As a landowner in PEN2, you pay an annual assessment on your property tax bill to help pay for the network of flood safety infrastructure that reduces the risk of flooding and handles storm-water for your property, the Columbia River and Columbia Slough.

Attending your annual landowner meeting is your chance to participate in managing the flood safety system that helps protect your property. Come elect the Board of Supervisors responsible for budgeting and policy-making for the district and hear updates on annual operations, upcoming projects, and ongoing efforts to modernize the infrastructure and how it is managed and funded.

At this year's meeting, we'll discuss progress made on implementing the US Army Corps of Engineer's Portland Metro Levee System Project, which represents a critical opportunity to receive significant federal funding to make a large set of improvements needed to strengthen the system, meet federal safety standards, and prepare for the impacts of climate change. We will also discuss efforts to establish a single district to manage the system and a more efficient and financially sustainable way of covering the costs of delivering flood safety for this important part of our region.

The Multnomah County Drainage District (MCDD) serves three drainage districts along the south shore of the Columbia River: Peninsula Drainage District #1 (PEN1), Peninsula Drainage District #2 (PEN2), and the Sandy Drainage Improvement Company (SDIC). The four districts collectively extend from the edge of Smith and Bybee Lakes on the west, to the Sandy River on the east and operate through intergovernmental agreements.
